

ANNUAL BUDGET REVIEW

The Budget is the financial road map for the club. In the annual budget, we forecasted our membership would drop to 140 and was projected to grow by 10 new members to restore the count to old levels. But after contacting everyone, we ended up at 130 members. The reductions were due to aging, health, moving away, or other interests. The projected revenue shortfall will be offset by the club's current surplus. Also, we continue to trim expenses where feasible.

GROWING OUR MEMBERSHIP

To offset the shortfall in membership, the Management Committee launched initiatives to build back the membership. Action items are:

- 'Do Your Friend a Favour' campaign ... for members to invite friends and neighbours to the club.
- Building awareness of Applewood Probus at key condos.
- Experimenting with a new Facebook page and FB ads aimed at our demographic.
- Exchanging ideas with other local Probus clubs.

Some initiatives will deliver results in the long run and others with more immediate results. But the fact remains we all have a role to play in growing our membership.

Upcoming Speaker - January 12 Nickolas Roulx, Royal Canadian Geographical Society

The January speaker is Nickolas Roulx, a Royal Canadian Geographical Society explorer-in Residence who journeyed by canoe and other means through Canada from North to south-from the high Arctic to Southern Ontario. This trip will be the focus of his presentation. Nickolas has accumulated years of experience as a canoe expedition Guide. As a Wildness First Responder, he is continually exploring new northern experiences. Since 2018 he has given more than 60 talks. He focuses on young people utilizing canoe expeditions as a lever for motivation, perseverance, and self-confidence.

Future Speakers - February 9 Andrew McKinney, Living Your Dreams in Retirement – the writing of a memoir

The February speaker is Andrew McKinney, author of *How I Lost My Hair Raising Teenage Girls and the lessons I learned*, Andrew was born in Toronto and grew up in Downsview. After wrestling with his career decision, Andrew enrolled in York University's science program, ultimately earning a Master of Science degree in Biochemistry.

As an executive in the pharmaceutical industry, Andrew learned only too well the pressures of work and family. He and his wife Karen, raised a son, two daughters, a cat and a dog. And despite some difficult years, he cherishes the good times and funny moments that occurred when least expected. By sharing his challenging yet humorous experiences, he hopes to entertain readers who have raised kids and

provide a roadmap to those beginning to navigate this stage of their lives.

The Apollo Murders by Chris Hadfield

There was general agreement that the book had some interesting technical details, particularly regarding space travel, but that it was not a success from the novel writing standpoint. At times, the technical detail was obtrusive. The characters are rather thinly drawn, and they undergo no development. Many aspects of the plot could have been followed further. The ending was a page turner, but melodramatic, with a Keystone Kops sort of feel to it.

The author's note at the end was helpful in providing details about the real people, places, and events in the story.

The tasters were given a list of 6 different meals (Lamb, Turkey, Back Ribs, Duck, Beef and Steak) and then required to try and match the wine being tasted with the meal. The idea was good but the execution... not so good!

In any event it was a lot of fun and at the end handouts were provided for each meal listing 5 separate pairings for each meal which, hopefully, will help out over the Christmas holidays.

Group 3 Wine Tasting – December 14, 2022


Group 3 met on Wednesday Dec 14, 2022 in the condo of Reg and Alison Perkin at The Fairways on Dixie Road S. Present were Bryce Atkinson, Jack Doney, Doug Gilpin, Neil Paget, Paul Walters, Marty Wanat, and Mike Preston (substituting for Don Steen who was unable to attend due to illness).

Reg had chosen 3 Pinot Noir and 3 Malbec with the advice of the Vitner David at the Dixie/Dundas LCBO. The wines originated from Argentina, France, New Zealand and USA. The big surprise was the last one we tasted, a Pinot Noir from California, which looked more like a Malbec, was the most expensive and scored the highest.

Machines Like Me by Ian McEwen

There was general agreement that this was a thought-provoking book, touching on major issues such as humanity, morality, and truth. Introspection is a hallmark of McEwen's books. Is the destruction of the android Adam equivalent to murder? The human characters were not well-developed, and the narrative somewhat choppy. The chapters of re-imagined history, while interesting, tended to detract from the flow of the story. Setting the book in the 1980s did give the opportunity for imagined and

enjoyable conversations with Turing. Two humans defined the emotional responses of an android: doubtless this gave rise to conflicting responses. The idea of an android being seduced is interesting, as is the idea of the android rebelling against the human "owner". On the other hand, giving a device with artificial intelligence specific rules regarding morality did lead to a very conservative attitude, unlike the human moral approaches arising from moral relativism.

Our leaves are falling. Come spring we will renew, But you, alas, fall once.
