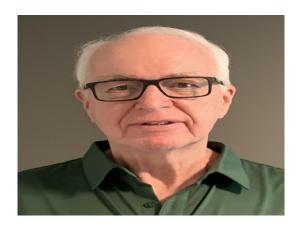

Ted's writing has regularly appeared in the national press, as well as magazines as diverse as Air Force, esprit de corps and Zoomer. He has also worked as host and contributor for most CBC Radio network programs, PBS in the U.S. and on TV Ontario. After 18 years teaching, he recently retired

as a full-time professor of journalism at Toronto's Centennial College.

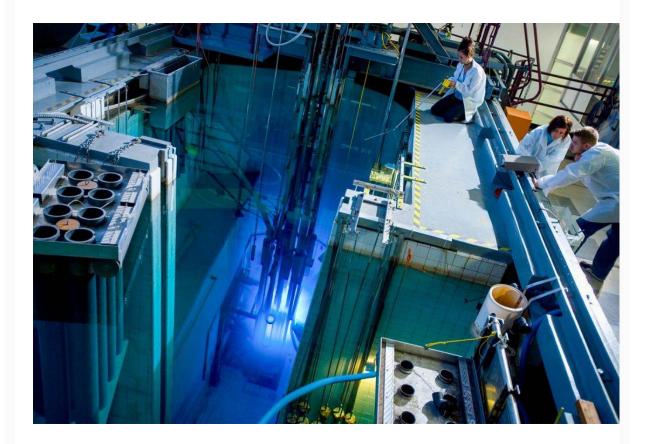
In 2011, he was one of 19 civilians presented with the Minister of Veterans' Affairs Commendation. In 2012, the Air Force Association of Canada selected Ted Barris to receive Queen Elizabeth II's Diamond Jubilee Medal.

fall of 2022 and immediately landed on the Globe and Mail and Toronto Star bestsellers lists.

McMaster Nuclear Reactor Tour - October 17, 2023

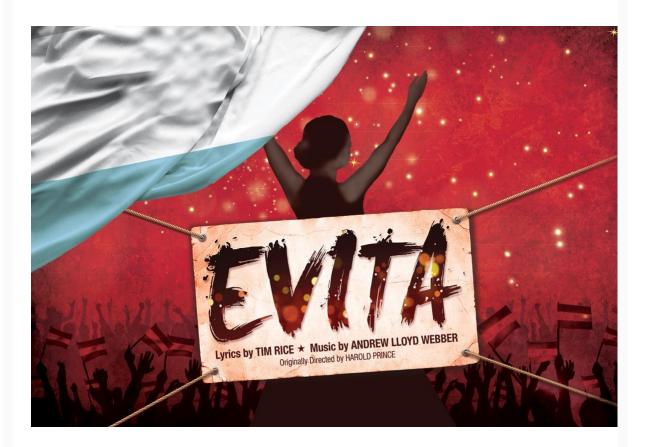

## Robert (Bob) Pinet, Historian "The Acadians"

Robert is one of our newest club members. He is an avid historian who has documented the history of his family, the Acadians, and their influence in North America.

Originally from the north eastern France, they were forced to move to North America during the religious wars in Europe. Most settled in what is now Nova Scotia and New

Brunswick. Subsequently, many were forced to move to the eastern areas of the United States by

the English that controlled Canada at that time. However, over time, many returned to the Canadian east coast. A large group settled in the bayou lands of Southern Louisiana where the subsequently became known as "Cajuns".

The language of Acadians is a mixture of English and French, making it unique to North American culture.

Although dispersed up and down the east coast of North America, family ties are important to this unique culture. Robert told us of a recent "family reunion" where bus loads of relatives attended from all parts of the east coast.

However times change. Queen Elizabeth II issued a Royal Proclamation apologizing for the force deportation of this unique group of people.

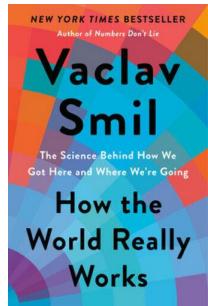

Book Club - August 2, 2023

How the World Really Works, by Vaclav Smil



This book is a digest of many of the Smil's earlier works. The author does a compelling job of bookkeeping the costs for production of food. For example, one tomato costs about 5 tablespoons of diesel fuel. Details such as this support the conclusion that humankind is a long way away from reaching CO2 emission goalposts. The five year window of politics clearly stands in the way of programs which must necessarily take a long time, such as the creation and commissioning of nuclear power plants.

The group agreed that the start of the book was difficult. Some graphs might have made for more graspable concepts. The extensive analysis of all kinds of risks was of dubious value, as was the deep dive into measurements of energy and power. The last two chapters were more engaging. While the author's tone reflects despair of progress in battling climate change (especially considering growth of China, India, and future growth of Africa), he does offer a number of practicable steps which could be helpful such as triple glazing of windows and improved food management. These are a much needed part of adaptation to climate change.
